Note: This is a sworn (affirmed) affidavit of the deponent only. No investigation has been conducted to confirm or verify the above and attached sworn information. THE CRIMINAL CODE OF CANADA provides that: everyone commits perjury who, with intent to mislead, makes before a person who is authorized by law to permit it to be made before him/her a false statement is false, is guilty of an indictable offence and is liable to a term of imprisonment not exceeding fourteen years (section 131, 132) or by summary conviction (section 134). Signing a false affidavit may expose you to prosecution under Sections 131 and 132 or 134 of the Criminal Code, R.S.O 1985, c. C-46 and also to civil liability for defamation.
